28% of children in Wales were growing up in poverty before the pandemic began – that's 7 children in a class of 25. As lockdown is lifted, schools are likely to see many more families struggling to afford the day-to-day expenses of sending their children to school.

Taking a <u>Cost of the School Day</u> approach involves action to reduce costs and remove poverty-related stigma in schools. Using a participatory children's rights approach, we work with everyone in the school to ensure no one is excluded, stigmatised or disadvantaged due to poverty.
