Tutorial 3: Exploring University Options

The purpose of this session, is to help you begin navigating the UCAS website, alongside other useful platforms, to discover entry requirements for subjects of interest to you.

Task 1

• Visit the UCAS website <u>www.ucas.com</u>. (*"Find courses, information and more")* and search for one subject from your year 12 options. You can navigate straight to the UCAS search engine by clicking on the link below.

- Using the filters, scroll down to **"Where do you want to study**?" E.g. South West, West Midlands, East of England, Wales, North East, London, Scotland etc. and research which universities in five different regions of your choosing, offer this subject course.
- Choose a university in each region offering the course and record their entry requirements in the table below.

Task 2

In the first task, we have asked you to carry out research into possible university courses based on your current year 12 options. There are currently over 50,000 undergraduate courses at more than 400 providers in the UK, so in this task, we would like you to look beyond your current subject options. You may already have an idea about a possible area of study you would like to pursue, e.g. law, medicine, design, business, sport etc. If so, you can explore this further in this task. Do not worry if you don't have any idea about what course you might like to study in the future or if you are unsure whether university study is even right for you, most students will be in this position when they start year 12. This exercise is all about giving you practice in using the UCAS website to explore possible options. So if you are unsure about course/university options, choose a course that just fits your current interests.

- Decide which area of study you would like to research.
- Search "Find courses, information and more".
- Select five universities in areas of the UK you would be prepared to go to, and enter the entry requirements of each in the table on page 3

Visit <u>www.whatuni.com</u> website and / or <u>www.theuniguide.co.uk</u> " to filter by possible grades at the end of year 13. **Be realistic!**

UCAS tariff points are used by some universities (around a third) when making conditional offers. Instead of asking for grades (e.g. BBC), a university may express the offer as 112 points. The table below shows the UCAS points for popular qualifications.

Remember that most courses accept the Welsh Baccalaureate as an alternative to an A-level or BTEC subject. The grades you get in the Welsh Baccalaureate are equivalent to the grades obtained at A-level

- If your GCSE predicted grades are all A * / A, look for universities that require grades *** AAB
- If your predicted GCSE grades are all A / B, look for universities that require AAA-BBC grades
- If your GCSE predicted grades are all B / C, look for universities that require BBB-CCD grades
- If your predicted GCSE grades are all Cs, look for universities that require CCC-DDE grades

Use the table below to help you calculate equivalent entry points to grades required.
